## **GETTING BACK UP AGAIN**

Mackenzy's Story of Hope in the Midst of A High School Pregnancy

"I was 16-years-old when I found out I was pregnant. Let me tell you, 16 year old me had no idea what I was in for when it came to becoming a mother. But while all of it was difficult to navigate, it didn't compare to the infinite amount of love and protection I gained the moment I held my beautiful baby girl for the first time. I immediately felt a love and connection that I could have never understood before and it generated in me a motivation to discover my potential and become the mother my daughter needed.

Prior to giving birth to my daughter, I had no idea what I wanted to do after high school. I struggled with the idea of going to college and making such a big commitment when I had no idea what my true interests were. After my pregnancy and delivery, I decided to pursue a career in nursing to make a positive impact on patients and their family members and give back to the career that had helped me work through such difficult times.

I quickly discovered that in order to get into nursing school, I had to maintain a high GPA. I found myself studying on the weekends and giving up time with friends to accomplish this goal. The doubts that came from multiple failures were inevitable. From failing and retaking a college course and not being accepted to the nursing program the first time that I applied, to retaking my nursing boards even after graduating, each failure forced me to dig deep, reflect on what I set out to do, and be the person I promised my baby girl I'd be.

In April of 2015, with the help of many, I graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. It was one of the proudest days of my life. It takes hard work, determination, and sacrifice to graduate from high school, earn a degree and raise a child. There will be plenty of failure throughout the ride. But that child will also be the very reason you get back up and try again until you succeed." -Mackenzy, Grand Rapids

Pro-choice philosophy says it's impossible to have a baby and accomplish one's dreams. Mackenzy's story shows the need for the life-affirming and empowering pro-life message in high schools, so women like Mackenzy can not only choose life, but rise to achieve their goals. ## TWO NEW PROGRAMS

For 13 years, we've been working with students around the state and have seen amazing change: from abortion-minded students choosing life for their babies to apathetic students standing against abortion and more.

There is no shortage of amazing stories from on-campus work, but there is a growing trend on campuses: early adoption of prochoice philosophy.

Sure, it's no secret that students are getting lost among seriously proabortion professors, administrations with silencing tactics, and a pop culture that celebrates abortion. But pro-choice philosophy doesn't start molding students in their freshman year, it often ensnares them years before college.

By the time many students reach college, they've already bought into the pro-choice agenda or have had one or more abortions.

Almost 2/3 of Christian students leave their faith & worldview in college.

Long story short: we are reaching students too late. High school students are being engaged in the abortion debate and we aren't there to defend our position.

This fall, we're launching a plan to build an army of pro-life defenders in high schools statewide. We'll also engage our network of college alumni to help. With their expertise and desire to stay engaged in the fight for life, paired with high schoolers' longing for truth, amazing change is bound to happen.


